Hello fellow Randall enthusiasts! I hope you and yours are doing well! I'm back to give you an update on the happenings at the Randall shop.

It's my pleasure to announce that Leon Peckham has taken the reins as Shop Foreman. He has literally been around the shop since childhood. His father, Jed, was Shop Foreman when he retired in 2014 after over 40 years. Leon himself has over 20 years with the Randall shop.

In other personnel matters, we've added a couple of new employees. I hope that they find a career in handmade knives as interesting and rewarding as I have! For those who don't know, it takes approximately 5 years of training for someone to reach the point that they are fundamental in the shop's performance.

Now onto the knives. As of January 1st, 2023 there was a small price increase across the board. Please refer to our latest catalog or visit [randallknives.com](http://randallknives.com) for current pricing. Feel free to call (407-855-8075) or email ([info@randallknives.com](mailto:info@randallknives.com)) the shop to request a current catalog. Your favorite Authorized Dealer should have catalogs as well.

As of March, 2023, we are booked ahead until April, 2029. Due to a lack of experienced personnel, we are currently 15 weeks behind our shipping schedule. In response to this, we have implemented a temporary reduction of 30% to our weekly production numbers until we can catch up to our shipping schedule. This doesn't affect the shipping date you received, or will receive, from the shop. We also had to, unfortunately, cancel our annual Spring Stock Sale. A Fall Sale is still up in the air. Please call the

shop in September to check. Please rest assured, the entire shop continues to work diligently to get your knives out!

The showroom and museum are open to the public. Our world-class museum is open Monday thru Thursday from 10am - 4pm. If you haven't already, it is a must-see for any Randall enthusiast! Showrooms hours are Monday thru Thursday 7am - 5pm and Friday 7am - 1pm.

Repairs take 4-6 weeks once payment is received. Please call the shop prior to sending in your Randall. Ship it well packed and insured, address it ATTN: Jason Randall, and make sure you include instruction and contact information, specifically an email address. Quotes for repairs are not given over the phone. Upon receipt, Jason will personally evaluate your Randall and give you a quote.

The Randall office has transitioned to a new order management system. This allows us to email your order acknowledgement once we process it. Please keep watch for these emails going forward. Feel free to call the shop to verify we have your updated email address on file.

Randall continues to support those who put themselves in harm's way with our Military and First Responders Program. There are certain base models available within 12-16 weeks at catalog price. Please come by the shop, call or email for further information.

In closing, the Randall family and shop would like to say thank you! We are all grateful to have so many passionate collectors and users of the knives we make!

This club has a very good friend in Bill Schulz, who's own "Soldier's Story" has been told in our "KNIFE KNEWS". Bill was in attendance at the 2022 U.S. Army Special Forces convention, held at The Antler Hotel in Colorado Springs, Co. this past fall. The following story is

about and partially took place at this venue.

Colonel Donlon's story is documented on the following pages. Timeframes and available space in this newsletter cannot properly scope the range of this man's career nor it's specifics. I hope you members find it informative, compelling and presented properly all things considered.

Bill Schulz presented Colonel Donlon with one of our very own RKCC Club knives #2, The Westmoreland, as a simple sign of gratitude for his service. The good Colonel was overwhelmed as is evident in the accompanying photos. This story "had" to be shared with all of you. I hope you agree....

## Colonel Donlon: Medal Of Honor Presentation.

---

### **ROGER HUGH CHARLES DONLON** **Colonel, United States Army Special Forces (Retired)**

Colonel Roger Donlon was born and raised in Saugerties, New York. His military career began with enlisted service in both the Air Force and Army. Commissioned through Officer Candidate School as an Infantry Officer in 1959, he spent the next 29 years serving in assignments based on a triad of his specialties as an Infantry, Special Forces and Foreign Area Officer

Notable among his many assignments: aide-de-camp to the Commanding General of the Yukon Command; Team Commander, 7th Special Forces Group (Airborne) in Vietnam; Commandant, Advanced Combat Training Academy in Korea; District Senior Advisor in Vietnam; Advisor to The Royal Thai Army in Bangkok, Thailand; Battalion Commander, 3rd Battalion, 7th Special Forces Group (Airborne) in Panama; Director of International Officers at the U.S. Army Command and General Staff College, Ft. Leavenworth, KS; and Commander, United Nations Command Rear Headquarters, Tokyo, Japan.

For conspicuous gallantry and intrepidity at the risk of his own life above and beyond the call of duty on 6 July 1964, Colonel Donlon became the first American soldier to be awarded the Medal of Honor in Vietnam. President Lyndon B. Johnson presented it on 5 December 1964 at the White House. Other awards and decorations include: The Legion of Merit; Bronze Star Medal; Meritorious Service Medal w/OLC; Joint Service Commendation Medal; Army Commendation Medal w/2 OLC; Purple Heart; Good Conduct Medal; National Defense Service Medal w/OLC; Armed Forces Expeditionary Medal; Vietnam Campaign Ribbon w/2 stars; Vietnam National Order Fourth Class; Vietnam Gallantry Cross w/palm; Vietnam Service Ribbon; Combat Infantry Badge; Parachutist Badge; Vietnam Parachutist Badge.

Colonel Donlon's military and civilian education include: The Special Warfare Course; Infantry Advanced Course; Command and General Staff College; Foreign Service Institute; U.S. Army Institute for Military Assistance, School of International Studies; and the Army War College. Colonel Donlon received a BA from the University of Nebraska at Omaha and an MS in Government from Campbell University. Honorary Degrees include a Master of Military Arts and Sciences from the Command and General Staff College at Ft. Leavenworth, KS and a Doctor of Humane Letters from Benedictine College in Atchison, KS.

Colonel Donlon is the author of *BEYOND NAM DONG*, a self-published autobiography. He is also the co-author of *OUTPOST OF FREEDOM*, published by McGraw-Hill and condensed for publication in the October 1965 issue of the *Saturday Evening Post*, which featured Colonel Donlon's picture on the cover. The *Reader's Digest Condensed Books Winter 1966* also featured Colonel Donlon's book. He was included in the "HEROES" series; a made for television documentary on the Arts and Entertainment channel, and is also the subject of a video entitled "ONE OF THOSE GOOD MEN" produced by Bolthead Productions.

Among his numerous civic awards and honors are the National Education Association; Golden Key Award; the Freedom's Foundation Freedom Leadership Medal; the American Legion Distinguished Service Medal and Award for Outstanding Heroism; the Jewish War Veterans' Americanism Award; the Mid-Hudson Valley Veteran of the Year Award. Since 1997 Colonel Donlon has sponsored an award for military excellence at the United States Military Academy Preparatory School; it is presented to the graduating cadet candidate selected as most outstanding in military aptitude. In 2011 he was presented with The Order of Saint Maurice (Primicerius) from the National Infantry Association for his significant and lasting contributions to the entire Infantry. Colonel Donlon has also been awarded the St. Philip Neri Gold Award from the National Special Forces Association (The Green Berets) for his more than 50 years of service to United States Army Special Forces. His spirit, dignity and patriotism along with his sacrifice and commitment epitomize all that St. Philip Neri stands for.

Colonel Donlon is a Life Member of The Congressional Medal of Honor Society; the Association of the United States Army; the National Special Forces Association; The Retired Officers' Association; the American Legion; and the Veterans of Foreign Wars.

Since retirement from the Army in December of 1988, Colonel Donlon has been made an Honorary Member of Rotary International; served on the Board of Trustees of People-to People International; was a Scholarship Friends Executive Committee member at Saint Mary College in Leavenworth; is a founding member of the Board of Trustees for the Command and General Staff College Foundation at Fort Leavenworth, Kansas; and is a member of the Vietnam Center National Council at Texas Tech University. In May of 1995 Colonel Donlon was inducted into the Fort Leavenworth Hall of Fame, the only non-General Officer to hold this distinction in the 20<sup>th</sup> century. In May of 1997 Colonel Donlon became the first recipient of the Outstanding Alumnus Award presented by the U.S. Army War College at Carlisle Barracks, PA. He is the 1998 recipient of the Silver Veteran's Medal presented by the Harry S. Truman Good Neighbor Award Foundation. In February of 2000 The Washington Times Foundation presented Colonel and Mrs. Donlon with the American Century Award. Appointed in May of 2004, Colonel Donlon served as the "Honorary Colonel" of the First Special Forces Regiment for six years. The Commanders Award for public service was presented to the Donlon's in 2013 for their 25 years of dedicated service sponsoring International Officers attending the Command and General Staff College at Ft. Leavenworth, KS. He received the first St. Martin of Tours Award (the patron saint of Soldiers) presented by Benedictine College for distinguished military service in September 2017. Along with his wife, Norma, served as Co-Grand Marshalls for the 2017 Wreaths Across America Convoy from Harrington, ME to Arlington National Cemetery.

On August 21, 2018, General Koji Yamazaki, Chief of Staff, Japan Ground Self-Defense Force (JGSDF) ordered the Defense Cooperation Award w/Shield be presented to Colonel and Mrs. Donlon for their 20 years of distinguished and meritorious service between the USA and Japan. In recognition of their long-term and warm-hearted commitment in support of JGSDF Officer Students (the future leaders of tomorrow) at the Command & General Staff College and Japanese Liaison Officers assigned to the Combined Army Center at Fort Leavenworth, Kansas.

The 7<sup>th</sup> Special Forces Group (Airborne) Headquarters Building at Eglin AFB, FL was named Donlon Hall on 5 December 2018

Colonel Donlon married Norma Shinno Irving on 9 November 1968 in Colorado Springs, CO. They have 5 children and 6 grandchildren.

Colonel Donlon's story cannot be told without his wife's. Norma Donlon, despite multiple barriers of all types, is a most remarkable woman. Here's her story...



**NORMA SHINNO IRVING DONLON**  
**Soldiers Widow... Soldiers Wife... Soldiers Mother...**  
**Devoted and Loving Grandmother**

Norma Donlon is an American of Japanese ancestry who was born in the Camp Jerome War Relocation Center in Denson, Arkansas during WWII. She was raised in New York, Michigan and California. Mrs. Donlon attended El Camino and Pierce Colleges in California. Her professional background is that of an Executive Assistant and Special Events Director. She has devoted her entire life to "people business" with her focus on the welfare of children.

At the age of seven Norma lost her hearing due to a high fever that destroyed the nerves in her ears. Learning to lip read she made the most of her circumstances and continued with her education and work goals. Her first husband, Army Ranger 1<sup>st</sup> Lt. John W. Irving, Jr. was killed in action in Vietnam, making her a Soldiers Widow and "Gold Star" wife at age 22. He was the first officer casualty from the 25<sup>th</sup> Infantry Division. Four years later Norma married again... another career Soldier... Roger Donlon.

As a Soldier's wife Mrs. Donlon moved 16 times in 20 years including 3 overseas assignments to Thailand, Panama and Japan. Always involved in her community she was a tireless advocate for Soldiers and their families and successfully combined her commitment to her own family of four sons with her responsibilities as a leader in church, school, scouting and Officers' Wives Club activities in a multi-national setting. Notable among her many achievements are: her work with the abandoned children's ward in Bangkok, Thailand; serving as the Chairperson of the Board of Governors for the Ft. Gulick Panama Pre-School; and being project chairperson and editor for the "Centennial Belle" a cookbook published in the spring of 1981 to commemorate the 100th anniversary of the Command and General Staff College at Ft. Leavenworth, KS. Mrs. Donlon has held every position in Cub Scouts from Den Mother to Chairman of the Pack! All of her sons achieved the Arrow of Light Award, the highest in Cub Scouting. In 1988 she was awarded the Department of the Army "Outstanding Civilian Service Medal" for her work as a consummate and caring community person, active with charitable, service and civic endeavors throughout Army communities world-wide.

Since her husband's retirement from the Army Mrs. Donlon has served as the Kansas State Representative for Japanese American Redress issues, is the Kansas contact for the Japanese American Historical Society and gives speeches seeking to educate people on the history of Americans of Japanese ancestry. She has also served as President, 1<sup>st</sup> VP, 2<sup>nd</sup> VP and Secretary of the Whittier Club, one of the oldest literary clubs in Kansas.

For representing the state of Kansas, Colonel and Mrs. Donlon were recognized with the American Century Award in 2000 presented by The Washington Times Foundation.

In 2012 Mrs. Donlon was awarded the "Shield of Sparta" Heroine of the Infantry by the National Infantry Association for her significant contributions to the Infantry. For her selfless ideals, true patriotism, commitment and courage to send her Soldier into harm's way.

For 25 years Colonel and Mrs. Donlon sponsored International Officer students attending the Command and General Staff College at Ft. Leavenworth, KS. They were recognized with the Commanders award for public service for their dedication in 2013.

## Norma Shinno Irving Donlon. (Continued)

Mrs. Donlon is the 7<sup>th</sup> woman recognized by the Special Forces Association with an Honorary Membership in April of 2017 for her 50 years of support to SF soldiers and communities.

In December 2017 Colonel and Mrs. Donlon served as Co-Grand Marshalls of the Wreaths Across America Convoy from Harrington, ME to Arlington National Cemetery(ANC) taking nearly 300,000 wreaths to place on every headstone at ANC. With 25 stops at schools, Veterans organizations, fire houses and police stations they spoke to crowds on the importance of Remembering our fallen... Honoring our veterans... and Teaching our next generation about freedom and patriotism. In February of 2018 Mrs. Donlon was appointed a Wreaths Across America Ambassador.

On August 21, 2018, General Koji Yamazaki, Chief of Staff of the Japan Ground Self Defense Force (JGSDF) ordered the Defense Cooperation Award with Shield be presented to Colonel and Mrs. Donlon for their more than 20 years of distinguished and meritorious service. In recognition of their long-term and warm-hearted commitment in support of JGSDF Officer Students at the Command and General Staff College (the future leaders of tomorrow) and Japanese Liaison Officers assigned to the Combined Arms Center at Fort Leavenworth, Kansas.

The Special Forces Charitable Trust presented Mrs. Donlon the 2018 Martha Raye Award for her 50 years of significant contributions to the Special Forces Community and unwavering support for SF soldiers and their families.

Married to Roger Donlon on November 9<sup>th</sup> 1968 in Colorado Springs, CO. The Donlons have 5 children and 6 grandchildren. Norma is passionate about her family... her faith... and our freedom!

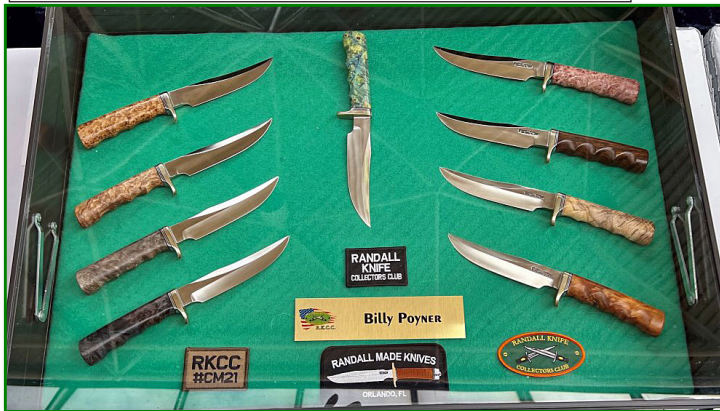

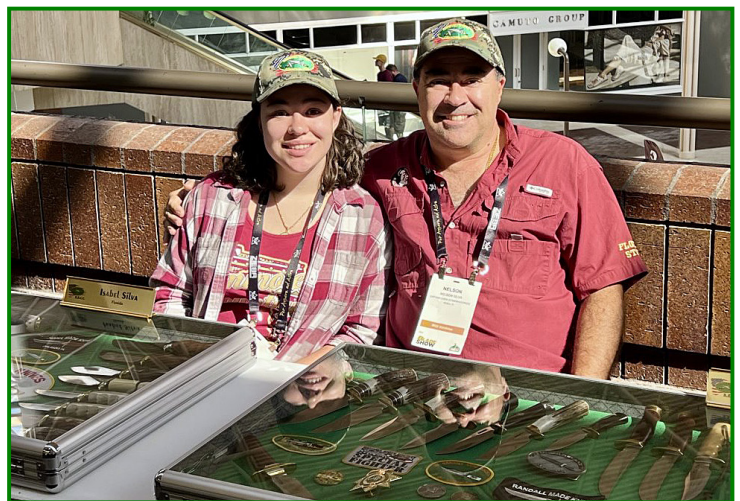

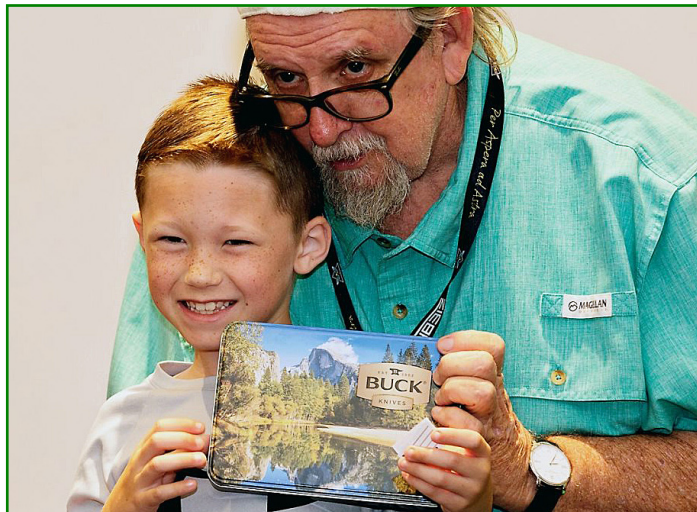
## The RKCC Annual Meeting-2022 & Blade Show Pics.




